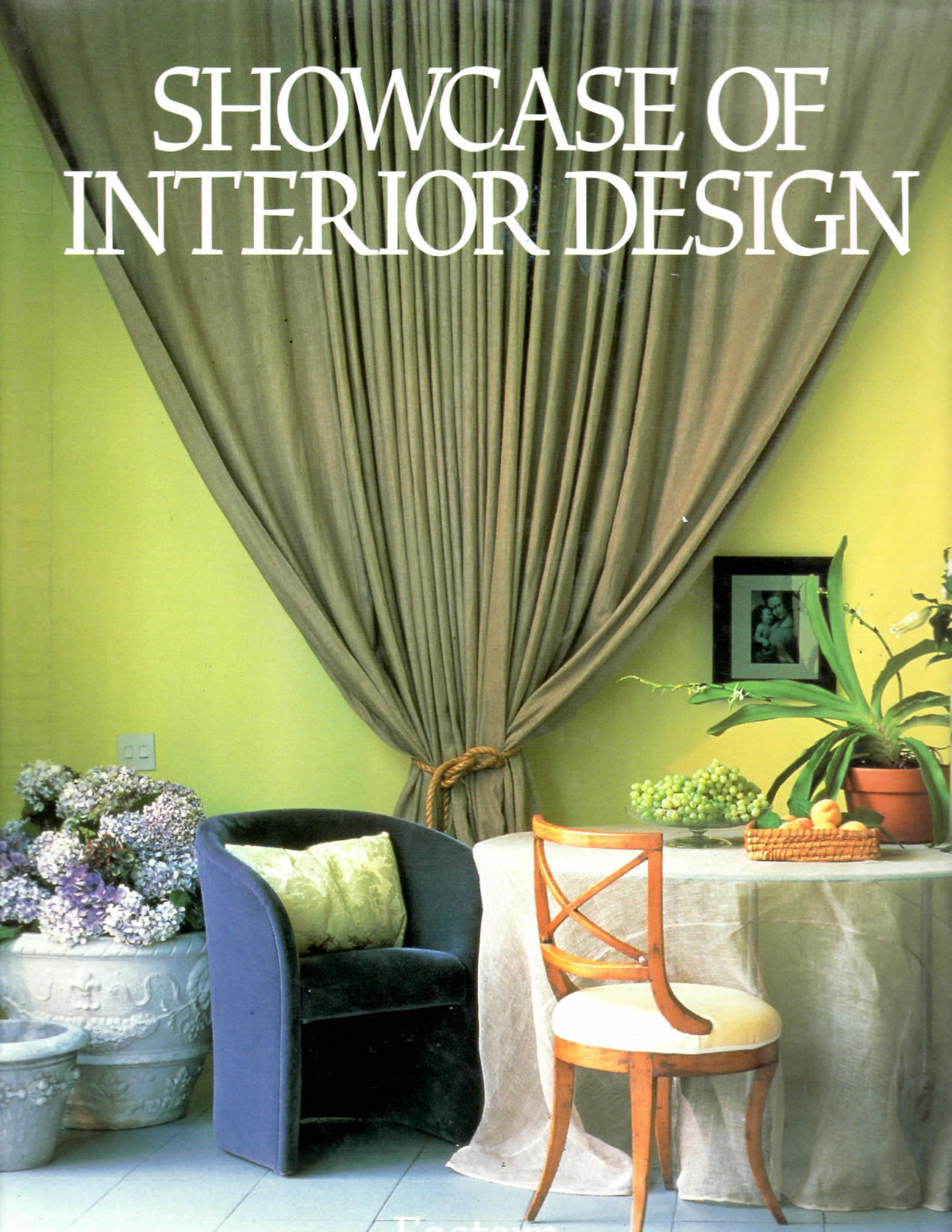


# SHOWCASE OF INTERIOR DESIGN

The master bedroom in a Federal townhouse was redesigned from three smaller rooms. "The Offering to Bacchus," a Brussels tapestry woven in 1710, is from Chevalier and balances three high windows. The custom bed is upholstered in a Brunschwig & Fils texture.



In the master bathroom, antique Wedgewood Basaltes urns from Bardith sit in the windowsills, softened by Roman shades of a Brunschwig & Fils casement.
